



(6) Hey Creative Spirits! **(6)**

Let's keep our shared space inspiring and ready for everyone's artistry! Remember that your mess is someone else's lost creative time. It takes just a few minutes to follow studio clean-up rules.

- Take a minute to look around before you leave and put away any materials left out: Glaze tongs, buckets, tools, boards, sponges, etc.
- Use a fully saturated sponge to eliminate all clay dust, glaze, and wet clay from the canvas on the tables. If there is clay debris on the floor, please sweep it up. Clay and glaze dust are a health hazard.
- Sponge down all clay residue and dust from the wood wedging table.
- Clean **ALL** tools, ribs, brushes, stamps, ware boards, sponges, buckets, and wheel bats before putting them back.
- Clean *inside AND outside* of buckets, rinse out sponges.
- Don't leave brushes in the slip containers. Make sure glaze bottle caps are back on bottles.
- Remove all clay from the slab rollers and deck after use, handles included; <u>the canvas should be left **flat and clean** for the next user</u>.
- Make sure the tops and sides of the wheel heads are clean, and turn off the wheels.
- Wipe off glaze buckets and make sure lids are on. Wipe bucket tops of any drips.
- Clean glaze drips off the floor and canvas with a wet sponge.

Please respect your fellow potters' creative time, and thank you for helping to make a clean healthy studio for our pottery family!
